WHAT IS CAMP RYLA?

It's a youth program of Rotary International and is sponsored by individual districts of Rotary International. This year Districts 544 and 545 will hold their second "Rotary Youth Leadership Awards Program" camp at the YMCA of the Rockies at Estes Park, Colorado from July 10 through 15, 1988.

The Rotary Youth Leadership Awards program is a RYLA youth camp under the direction of District Rotarians. Scholarship awardees are selected by Rotary Clubs in the District. Eligible to attend are outstanding young men and women who will be juniors or seniors in their local highschools the fall of 1988. The YMCA of the Rockies provides a scenic campus in the Rocky Mountains for Camp RYLA. The altitude is 8,000 feet providing an unusually fine climate for active campers in the bright sunshine and cool shade - and a perfect place for a five day youth seminar.

The Student will learn of the blessings and responsibilities of being a citizen of a free society; they will understand the greatness of the American free enterprise system; and they will realize how important the objects of Rotary and the Rotary Four-Way test are to establish moral values and the ideal of service.

By working with todays youth leaders we are trying to help guarantee a bright future for todays and tomorrows generation. SELECTION OF RYLA AWARDEES

RYLA SUMMER CAMP July 10, through July 15, 1988 Estes Park, Colorado 80511

QUALIFICATIONS

- 1. The awardees to be selected are to be sophomore or junior students in the academic year that will end in May prior to the camp in July.
- 2. The awardees should be considered leaders of their peers or be of leadership quality. These awardees could be from any race or from any economic group as long as they have leadership potential and qualities.
 - A. The awardees should be in good academic standing.
 - B. Leaders in their respective classes.
 - C. Athletically inclined (this might be desired but is not a prerequisite.)

Recommended Process of Selection

- 1. Visit with your local high school principal, assistant principal, counselor and/or teachers; ask them to supply you with names of six youth leaders, along with their school records or academic standing, address, parents name, etc.
- 2. Contact all six youth leaders, even though all will not be selected. Explain the RYLA program to those nominated as a group, ask if they would allow their name to be considered as an awardee. Set up a meeting with each of the prospective awardees and his parents to explain the Camp. What, where, when, why, and how needs to be explained to both the parents and prospective applicant. Make sure the parents are truly interested because they will be your best supporters.
- 3. Set up a time for the committee to interview each applicant. This will allow the committee to become better acquainted with each applicant. So you can narrow the field, it is suggested that you use a point system to rate each applicant. If necessary, you could have short essays on the Free Enterprise System, Economics, etc. Sometimes the awardees are presented at the high school annual awards assembly. This gives the awardees the additional recognition at school.
- 4. Once your awardees have been selected, notify Dave Bevans and a Campers Booklet will be sent.

5. When the registration forms in the Campers Booklet have been completed, mail them with your Clubs check (if not previously sent) in the amount of \$250 (payable to Rotary RYLA) for each camper to:
