1989 RYLA Proposal Paper No. 14 Junior Counselors

Proposal

Base Case

- 1. Eliminate junior counselors.
- Solicit Rotarians/spouses to perform essential support tasks.
- Act as back-up counselors in case of pre-mature departure of group counselor.

Alternative (If adult support unavailable)

- 1. Limit junior counselors to two.
- Clearly identify junior counselor activities as "go for", clean up detail, and general assistance reporting to the camp coordinator (i.e., Warren Holm).
- Do not assign junior counselor to any group.
- 4. Screen and select only most mature junior counselors so they can act as backup counselor if counselor must depart.

Rationale

- Original intent of junior counselors was to help develop and pass RYLA traditions from one camp to the next, provide leadership to groups, and assist staff in operation of the camp.
- The level of maturity of junior counselors varied widely in the 1988 RYLA camp, in several cases detracting from the performance of the group. It merely provided the opportunity for a second all expenses paid RYLA experience with less requirement to conform to the rules applying to the first time campers.
- It is unlikely that a solicitation will identify enough well qualified junior counselors to provide one for each group resulting in unbalanced experience and direction, i.e., seniors versus juniors and sophomores.

- Ten to twelve junior counselors displace opportunities to provide scholarships to other new campers.
- Ten to twelve junior counselors costing \$125 to \$150 each add between \$1,250 and \$1,800 to the camp expenses.
- Qualified adults or an alternative, mature junior counselors will provide the necessary counselor backup and support resources.

Proposal Proposal

- Drop the junior achievement program.

Rationale

- Program pre-empted 3 1/2 hours of program.
- Junior achievement pre-empted rap time activities.
- Counselors have insufficient time to prepare. To properly prepare would take considerable advanced work which makes the camp more burdensome than necessary. This may tend to discourage recruitment of counsellors.
- Over focus on a single subject.
- Use time to get in business leaders and/or academic leaders to talk about the social role, control, ownership, and application of profit.
